PUBLIC HEARING FOR 2019 BUDGET

Chairman Andy Bushman called the public hearing for the 2019 Budget to order at 6:30pm, with Trustees Jim McCaskey and Irene McMullen and Fiscal Officer Judy Toth present. Mr. Bushman led the Pledge of Allegiance. Mrs. Toth advised that she reduced the road materials line item so that there would be a positive balance in the Road and Bridge Fund. There were no other changes. Mr. Bushman opened the floor for questions or comments from the public. There being none, the Trustees closed the public hearing.

Irene McMullen moved and Jim McCaskey seconded to close the public hearing at 6:31pm, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried.

REGULAR MEETING

Mr. Bushman called the regular meeting to order at 6:32pm. The Board signed warrants 15862-15908 dated 7/10/18 totaling \$48,413.24 and EFT Vouchers 185-193 for the 7/10/18 biweekly payroll totaling \$9,505.39. Warrant 15891 was voided.

MINUTES

Irene McMullen moved and Jim McCaskey seconded to approve the minutes of June 12, 2018, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried.

Irene McMullen moved and Jim McCaskey seconded to approve the minutes of June 26, 2018, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Recycling

Resident Eleanor Semenik thanked Anne Wishart for her article in the *Maple Leaf*. She sympathized with the resident on Sherman Road who purchased his home unaware that the recycling site was to be moved in close proximity to his property. She suggested that the Board put up a wall and move it back to its former location where there was a pine tree buffer and security cameras. Scenic River Park, another consideration, was too isolated and would become a dumping ground. Mr. Bushman advised the Board was looking at various locations. Fowlers Mill Swale

Superintendent Jim Teichman met with Rich Ferlin regarding the swale across his property, which was removed during the Fowlers Mill Road resurfacing project. Mr. Teichman discussed replacing the swale and installing a drive pipe on the Ferlin property. All three of the affected property owners were present. Their properties are at the highest point of the road. Mr. Ferlin advised that run-off is now going down his driveway and into his neighbor's garage. Deb Roche was concerned that the water was ruining her driveway. Mr. Bushman will contact the county engineer. The residents will be notified if the engineer recommends a drive pipe. KLATKA PIPE

Let the record reflect bids were opened for the Klatka Pipe Replacement Project on Friday June 29 at 3:05pm. There were seven bidders. The county engineer recommended Grade Line, Inc. Irene McMullen moved and Jim McCaskey seconded to award the contract for the replacement of the Klatka Drive culvert to Grade Line, Inc. for \$59,998, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried.

ROAD REPORT/ROAD SUPERINTENDENT JIM TEICHMAN

Irene McMullen moved and Jim McCaskey seconded to authorize Jim Teichman to advertise for the position of a service department employee, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried. Mr. Teichman gave the Board three quotes to refurbish the entering Munson signs. The Trustees will review the quotes and determine the number of signs to be done each year. PUBLIC COMMENT

Berm Mower

Former road service employee Mark Stukbauer asked if the brakes on the berm mower were repaired, a matter that he brought to the Trustees' attention at his exit interview. Mr. Teichman advised that in addition to the brakes, broken disc plates were fixed. The mower was used 3-4 times, and is back in the shop for repairs.

LIQUOR PERMIT/TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP

Irene McMullen moved and Jim McCaskey seconded that the Trustees waive the hearing for the liquor permit for the Mayfield Sand Ridge Club, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried.

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LIGHTING FOR MAINTENANCE BUILDINGS

Mr. Bushman will contact a second contractor for a quote for lighting for the maintenance buildings.

MEMORIAL TREE

Mr. McCaskey sent the information to the Park Board and is waiting for their response. RECYCLING AREA

Mr. McCaskey overlayed his sketch with the aerial topography and forwarded copies to the Township office and to the affected residents. Although an advocate of recycling, he wanted the Board to either fix it or finish it. Resident Tom Norton received a copy of the plan and paced off the rough drawing with Aaron Koehler, who lives across the street from the recycling area, and who unfortunately could not be present that evening. Mr. Norton asked for an eightfoot fence because of the height of the containers, and asked how quickly this could be done. Mr. McCaskey contacted ODOT. If a tree is less than 12 inches in diameter it can be taken down at any time. If larger, or if it has shaggy bark or is dead, it cannot be taken down until November 1 as it may be a nesting site for a protected species of Indiana brown bats. Mr. Norton wanted to know if this would delay the project until next year and asked about a gate and about limiting access. Mr. McCaskey thought it was still possible to move forward this year if the Board found a viable solution. Resident Eleanor Semenik asked the Board to move the recycling center back to its original location and erect a fence, or to shut it down.

SWEARING IN OF NEW FIRE CHIEF AND 45-YEAR AWARD

The Trustees recessed the meeting at 7pm and moved to the community room. Several members of the fire department, their families, former Chief Bernie Harchar, and members of the community were present to attend the swearing in of newly appointed Fire Chief Alan Zwegat, and to honor John Bitonti for his 45 years of service to the Munson Fire Department. Interim Chief Mike Vatty gave the introductions. Chairman Bushman administered the oath of office, and Chief Zwegat's wife Connie pinned his badge. He briefly greeted those present and acknowledged his father in the audience. Mike Vatty introduced John Bitonti and thanked him and his family for his many cold and delayed dinners and for his 45 years of service. Chief Zwegat presented him with his pin. Refreshments were served afterward in the Fire Station. The Trustees retuned to the meeting room and resumed the meeting at 7:10pm.

FIRE REPORT/MIKE VATTY

Fire Department member Matt Hartman secured a \$3,897 grant for the fire department from Ohio Department of Public Safety from revenues from seat belt violations, to be used for EMS equipment. Alyssa Fox applied for and received a \$2,000 grant for a smoke detection program. The final inspection for the Notre Dame memory care center will be July 17. Six to seven "fire" drills will be required.

RESOLUTION 2018-35/FUND TRANSFER

Resolution 2018-35 was made by Irene McMullen and seconded by Jim McCaskey for within fund transfers in the General Fund in the 2018 Permanent Appropriation, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried. [The resolution is included on a separate page as part of the minutes.] MONTHLY REPORT

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PUBLIC COMMENT

Recycling Center

Resident Tom Norton asked for a firm date for a solution to the recycling issue to avoid dragging it out. Mr. Bushman noted that the County Commissioners would work with the Township to get out of its contract with Geauga Trumbull if that was the direction the Trustees chose. Mr. McCaskey wanted two months and explained that the Board cannot make decisions outside of its public meetings, which draws out the process. He preferred to find a solution to keep the recycling site open, but was not against closing it if the Board could not find a solution. Mr. Norton asked for a cutoff date. He asked the Board to move it back to its former location and to erect a fence to eliminate the health concerns that caused the site to be moved in the first place, and. Mrs. McMullen explained that there were other issues that could not be resolved with a fence. Resident Rich Ferlin suggested closing the site until the Trustees could come up with a solution.

RESOLUTION 2018-33/RENEWAL 5 YEAR 1 MILL FIRE LEVY

WHEREAS, The amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten mill limitation will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of said Munson Township, Geauga County, Ohio; therefore be it

RESOLVED, By the Board of Trustees of the Township of Munson, Geauga County, Ohio, two-thirds of all members elected thereto concurring that it is necessary to levy a tax in excess of the ten mill limitation for the benefit of Munson Township for the purpose of

the general construction, reconstruction, resurfacing, and repair of streets, roads, and bridges; as provided and authorized in ORC Section 5705.19 (G)

at a rate not exceeding 2.00 mills for each one dollar of valuation which amounts to 20 cents for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for a five (5) year period of time, which levy is a renewal of an existing levy of 2.00 mills. The tax shall first be levied in tax year 2018 and begin collection in 2019. The subdivision has territory affected in Geauga County, Ohio.

RESOLVED, That the question of levying additional taxes be submitted to the electors of said Munson Township, and if passed the tax shall be levied upon the entire territory, at the general election to be held at the usual voting places within said Munson Township on November 6, 2018; and be it further

RESOLVED, That said levy be placed upon the tax list of the current year if a majority of the electors voting thereon vote in favor thereof; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Fiscal Officer of the Township of Munson is hereby directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Elections Geauga County, Ohio, on or before August 8, 2018 by 4:00pm (E.S.T.) and notify the Board of Elections to cause notice of election on the question of levying said tax to be given as required by law.

The tax shall first be levied in tax year 2018 and begin collection in 2019. The subdivision has territory affected in Geauga County, Ohio.
